FYI: Next Sunday, the ELCA Mission Investment Fund will be sending a photographer to take pictures of our building and worship.





Good Shepherd's VBS at a glance:

- Our VBS is open to 3 year olds (by June 17) through outgoing 5th graders.
- We love our small-group model! Children that have just completed Kindergarten through Grade 5 are thoughtfully placed into small mixed-age groups. Studies and our own experience have shown that children thrive in this model - younger children look up to older ones; cooperation increases and competitiveness decreases.
- 3-5 year olds use the nursery as their home base and enjoy a simplified rotation schedule.
- Our time begins with dinner at 5:00p. Students will go through three rotations (music, games, and bible stories) before we wrap up at 7:30p.
- Each day we learn about and collect offerings for a mission project.
- \$50/child, family max of \$200.

If needed, a changing table is found in the nursery bathroom.
- We have a family-sized, accessible restroom available for all near the sanctuary entrance. On the basement level at the far end of the building, you will find another single-stall, accessible restroom as well as multi-stall men's and women's restrooms.
- Hearing assistance is available. If you have a hearing aid with a t-coil, set
 your device to this setting. If you do not have a hearing aid with a t-coil,
 there are individual hearing devices available. Ask an usher or soundboard
 volunteer for one.
