The doves descending from the heavens above you are origami doves, most made in the spring of 2020 under the leadership of Nola Roth. We thought we'd be moving back into the restored Good



Shepherd building (after the fire) that spring, but then COVID came and we were all isolating in our bubbles. Nola recruited volunteers to make the white doves – one for each child and adult member – and then assembled them into a dramatic hanging that we got to see on the online Pentecost worship service. We finally saw it in-person during our "Homecoming" service in September 2021. We don't have good records of all the people who made the doves, but we know that Nola, Barb Hunt, Richard Sehl, and some families, including the Albrecht-Johnson family, made many of the doves. The red doves were made this spring by Carl Heine, Barb Hunt, Jo Mohan, and Sean Daly. Jo also made the banners hanging on either side of the cross, and Mark Ledogar did the installation. Thanks to everyone who contributed to this dramatic reminder of the Holy Spirit who is always enveloping us.

Oak Park Memorial Day Ceremony Monday, May 27, 11a

This Memorial Day marks the 80th anniversary of the Normandy invasion, an epic battle that changed the course of history in World War II. D-Day will be remembered in remarks at Oak Park's Memorial Day Ceremony in Scoville Park. The ceremony is organized by GSLC member Brian Flora and includes participation by our Chaplain Kerstin Hedlund and Village President Vicki Scaman.

On Saturday, June 1 at 2p veterans Carl Fisher and Brian Flora will participate in a DAR organized 80th Anniversary of D-Day program at the Oak Park main library. Carl is an experienced Normandy and D-Day sites guide who has led amateur historians, interested tourists and military veterans across the Normandy countryside. After Brian describes his father's role in the first wave at Omaha Beach, Carl will lead a photographic travelogue to highlight the places and people associated with Operation Overlord.
